60,000 more homes and businesses in Staffordshire to get £24m broadband boost

Around 60,000 more homes and businesses in Staffordshire are set to benefit from a broadband boost as part of a £24 million investment by Openreach.

People living and working a number of locations – including Cheslyn Hay, Heath Hayes, Rugeley and Stafford – are all set to benefit from the national upgrade plan, which will take place between now and 2026, with the majority of premises in each area gaining access to ultrafast full fibre broadband.

The news comes hot on the heels of a <u>similar announcement last</u> <u>month</u>, when 185,000 premises — in mainly rural and harder to serve areas across the West Midlands — were also included in Openreach's build plan.
