Vortex IoT managing director and co-founder Adrian Sutton Engineers from the company are using digital technology to get a clearer picture of the extent of the problem in the county.

That will inform the council of pollution hotspots and previously unknown sources, which, combined, will enable the authority to take measures to improve air quality and ultimately improve the health of residents.

They are now getting used to the sight of digital sensors attached to lampposts as the main plank of the data-retrieving operation.

Vortex IoT has fitted 70 sensors in areas like Margam, Taibach, Aberavon, and the surrounds of Baglan Energy Park.

Vortex IoT will also create 50 highly skilled engineering and manufacturing jobs in the next 18 months.

Mr Sutton said: "We are really privileged to be working with Neath Port Talbot Council and Swansea Bay City Deal on this pioneering project.

"I live in the area and our company has its roots in the Swansea Bay City region. The opportunity to deliver an environmental impact to the community in which we are based and to contribute to improved air quality and decarbonisation is one we are truly excited about. We will go above and beyond to deliver value to the residents of Neath Port Talbot."
