Call to 'keep hospitality in the loop' as first Omicron Covid variant case reported in Wales

Hospitality businesses across Wales must be "kept in the loop" over the next few weeks say the Welsh Conservatives as the first Omicron Covid variant case is reported in Wales.

The Omicron variant of concern — which has caused a surge in cases in South Africa — was identified in the Cardiff and Vale University Health Board area. Health chiefs say the case is linked to international travel.

It comes as Wales has seen Covid cases, hospitalisations and deaths falling in recent weeks but there are fears the variant could trigger another wave of infections, like those seen with the Alpha and Delta variants.
