

Four firms move into the Cotton Exchange in Liverpool

Bruntwood Works has secured four new lettings at the Cotton Exchange in Liverpool.

International transportation business Genco Shipping & Trading has moved into a 1,050 sq ft fully refurbished space on the building's second floor.

Creative and digital agency Kaleidoscope has expanded its presence at Cotton Exchange by agreeing a new 1,400 sq ft workspace on the sixth floor, while hospitality training business Ways to Wow has chosen the building for its new office.

They are joined by Ellis Williams Architects, which has agreed a deal for a 1,100 sq ft workspace in the Grade II-listed building on Bixteth Street.
