Scunthorpe packaging specialist CorrBoard UK has a new managing director.

Rob Burgin, formerly general manager for DS Smith Northfields in nearby Louth, will take on the responsibility for the running of the £35 million turnover business, a specialist producer of corrugated sheet board.

The appointment is described as the first of a series of

senior hires that are planned at the business as the senior management team is strengthened over coming months.

Paul Barber, former managing director and Will Tilney, sales and commercial manager, left to pursue career opportunities elsewhere in late 2021.

Belgian multinational VPK Packaging Group owns 50 per cent of the shares, having increased its holding with the buy-out of Garthwest in 2020. The remainder is held by a UK-based consortium of sheet plants comprising of Dairi-Pak, Fencor Packaging Group, GWP Group, McLaren Packaging and Swanline Print.

VPK produces recycled paper and paper-based packaging, with markets in food and beverages, consumer goods and e-commerce, tubes and cores. With an annual turnover of £1.3 billion, the group employs more than 6,100 employees at more than 65 production sites in 19 countries.

CorrBoard started production in Scunthorpe in 2014, employing 80 people.
