

Planning consultancy firm expands with Bristol architecture team

Property planning consultancy Marrons has expanded in the South West by establishing a new architecture team in Bristol.

The Midlands-headquartered firm, which has an office on Queen's Square in the centre of Bristol, has made three appointments, with a view to recruiting more staff next year as part of a growth strategy for the region.

Director of architecture Tom Macklen, senior architect Will Thomas and architectural assistant Isabelle Firkins, previously worked at Barton Willmore and have more than 20 years' combined experience within the property and construction sector.
