Property developer transfers new batch of properties to housing association

The property developer behind the Stanton Chase development in Swindon has transferred nine homes to a local housing association partner.

Persimmon Homes Wessex has delivered the tranche after contracts were exchanged with West Oxfordshire's largest affordable housing provider, Cottsway Homes for 34 homes in June.

The 34 properties are part of a larger development which will include 190 new properties in total when complete. The new development will offer a mix of one, two, three and four-bed properties for affordable rent and shared ownership, including two wheelchair-adaptable homes. The can be purchased on the open market from £254,995.

In addition, the Stanton Chase development, which is four miles from Swindon's town centre, will feature a convenience store. The site also has easy access to the mainline railway station, the A420 to Oxford and the A419, which connects with Junction 15 of the M4.

The transfer of this latest batch of homes follows Swindon Council's leader and Cabinet Member of Housing's visit to the site in August. They were given a tour of the 113-home phase currently under construction.
