A hair salon hit by devastating flooding at the start of the year reopened this week after a major renovation.

Tommy's Hair Company — run by Dutch owners Tommy and Esther van Der Veken — opened on Clwyd Street in Ruthin back in 2005 and has been successful in the town.

But in January, Tommy's, along with many other neighbouring businesses and homes were sadly left with a trail of destruction following flash flooding throughout the town centre – leaving the salon under a large amount of water.
