The company last month announced full year results for the year to July 31 2022 in which revenues grew 37.5% to f1.07bn, while operating profit also rose by 14% to top f136m.

North Eastern region (Leeds and Newcastle), said: "By growing our regional presence, we can not only better service our current customers but also increase our footprint nationally. We have strong coverage across the UK already however, there is a large opportunity for growth and recruitment between our Leeds and Glasgow offices.

"This new office will help us to provide a local service with a multinational portfolio of products, solutions and services both to our existing customers and new customers. Newcastle Upon Tyne is the perfect location."
