PwC

Professional services giant PwC <u>announced in October</u> that it is to create up to 1,000 jobs over three years at its newly-launched technology hub in Manchester.

The technology-focused roles will be in addition to existing recruitment of 3,000 people per year.

The company added that at least 100 of the new jobs are being recruited immediately for the tech hub which will be located at the firm's Manchester office at 1 Spinningfields where 1,400 people are currently based.

The hub will focus on developing technology products and assets for use across PwC's business and to support client work.

Uber



Ride hailing app Uber <u>revealed in September</u> that it wants to recruit 500 more drivers in Merseyside to meet huge post-lockdown demand.

The global giant said it was part of a national recruitment drive that will see it sign up a further 20,000 drivers as demand for rides continues to increase.

All Uber drivers are now entitled to at least the National Living Wage — after changes in the law were introduced — although many do earn more.

Mowgli Street Food

Indian restaurant chain Mowgli Street Food <u>confirmed in</u>
October that it is on track to increase its staff numbers to
700 by the middle of 2022.

The Liverpool-headquartered company was founded by West Lancashire-born barrister-turned-entrepreneur Nisha Katona.

The business is planning to expand into Preston, Bristol, Brighton, Edinburgh and Glasgow.

Mowgli Street Food has been backed by private equity firm Foresight Group since it injected £3.5m in 2017. At the time, Mowgli was operating from two sites in Liverpool and Manchester.

Mowgli is aiming to launch four to five new restaurants per year and has ambitions to open in Newcastle, Chelmsford and Cambridge.

More than 300 LGV driver apprenticeships are being created by the Co-op in response to the crisis <u>earlier this year.</u>

The programme will run for 12-15 months across the UK, with drivers becoming fully operational after three months.

Starting salaries will range between £23,753 and £25,584, depending on location.

Co-op Food chief executive Jo Whitfield said at the time: "The transport sector needs long-term sustainable change. Through our apprenticeship programme we'll be able to help driver recruitment by attracting new talent and make the sector more appealing to younger people."

TalkTalk

Telecoms giant TalkTalk <u>announced the creation of almost 180</u>
new jobs - after celebrating the "first wave" of young people
completing their six-month Kickstart placements.

The Salford-based firm announced in September that it had 123

vacancies across the business, as well as an additional 56 new Kickstart roles.

It news came after the connectivity provider hosted a graduation event for its first wave of Kickstart placements at its Soapworks HQ.

Almost 50 young people were welcomed into the business on Kickstart placements — the Government scheme created last year aiming to deliver opportunities for young people. 30 of those Kickstarters have found permanent roles as a result of their placement.

British premium sports fashion brand Castore <u>announced in April</u> it was to relocate its headquarters from Liverpool to One Central Street in Manchester city centre and create 300 jobs over the next two years.

The business signed a 13-year lease with landlord Kinrise to occupy all available workspace - c.22,100 sq ft - within the building across five floors.

<u>Founded in 2015 by brothers Thomas and Philip Beahon</u>, Castore currently sells products in more than 50 countries worldwide and includes collaborations with sports stars such as Andy Murray.

Castore has now relocated all staff from current headquarters in Liverpool to Manchester.

Matillion

Matillion's office in Altrincham Greater Manchester's latest unicorn Matillion <u>created almost</u> 180 jobs in 2021 as it gears up for further global expansion.

The cloud data company now has a headcount of 390 compared to the total of 213 it employed at the end of 2020.

Speaking exclusively to BusinessLive in October, CEO and founder Matthew Scullion added the Altrincham firm is looking to "double down" on its operations in the US and "triple down" in Europe over the coming years."

The company raised \$150m in a funding round led by a US investment giant with stakes in the likes of Gymshark, BuzzFeed and Squarespace which values the business at \$1.5bn.

The Manchester-based online fashion retailer revealed the news in its 2021 Economic Impact Report, which outlined the firm's almost £2bn in GVA to the UK economy since 2009.

The jobs will be created over the next five years, and Boohoo said the investment will help the firm continue its "Incredible growth".


Greater Manchester-based musicMagpie <u>is adding hundreds of</u> <u>jobs</u> over the next three years after it completed its float on AIM in 2021.

The company currently employs more than 700 people worldwide, with 400 employees based at its current UK studio headquartered in Wilmslow, Cheshire.

The Wilmslow team will relocate to the new headquarters at Enterprise City.

DAM Health



The Spine in Liverpool is the headquarters of DAM Health Liverpool-headquartered Covid-19 testing firm DAM Health revealed plans to create more than 350 jobs in 2022.

The company already employs close to 1,000 people across all of its divisions in the UK and internationally across technical, customer service and office-based staff.

A significant part of the recruitment drive is for technical

staff with almost 300 new staff required for its laboratories to meet the ongoing demand for antigen and PCR testing.

By the end of 2021 DAM Health will have a total of 12 labs operational in Manchester, Kent, Edinburgh, Birmingham, Hull, Cornhill, two in Fulham, Glasgow, Antrim, Harlow and the original Rose Lane site in Liverpool.

The city region has struck the deal with Octopus Energy Group which will see the company trial the uptake of new green

energy tariffs for customers in Greater Manchester..

Through the partnership, Octopus Energy will also create 300 jobs in the area, ranging from data scientists and heat pump engineers to frontline customer support.

A Manchester-based artificial intelligence (AI) start-up announced in August that it is creating more than 200 jobs within the following 12 months after it raised \$75m in a funding round with the world's largest technology investor.

The confirmation came after BusinessLive reported that SoftBank's Vision Fund II had agreed to acquire a stake in

Peak, which counts PepsiCo and the fashion retailer PrettyLittleThing among its clients.

The news also came after Peak <u>announced in February</u> it was to create 130 jobs after it raised \$21m through a Series B funding round led by London-based venture capital firm 0xx, with participation from MMC Ventures and Praetura Ventures and new investor Arete.

At the time, the move brought Peak's total funding raised to \$43m.

Beelivery

UK drivers <u>said in July</u> that it will double that number over the coming two years.

Beelivery has begun another enormous recruitment drive, with the hired drivers able to pick and choose when they work, and accept or reject trips as they wish.

Launched in 2015, it's not the first massive jobs announcement by the firm in recent months. In September last year, the firm announced it was to hire 20,000 staff — taking its total headcount to 40,000 by Christmas. That figure is now 50,000 — and is set to grow to 100,000 by 2023.
